Townshend goes to Hollywood

When Christopher Guest's new "mockumentary" is released Jan. 1, 2006, look for a familiar face-er, hull-in a brief but compelling role.

The NWMC/WBF longboat Townshend was hired to appear in For Your Consideration, the newest comedy from screenwriter and director

Guest (Best in Show, Spinal Tap). Production staff apparently located Townshend in an Internet search.

Last month NWMC/WBF volunteer staffer Gordon W. Trzinski drove the trailered boat to Hollywood, the most harrowing part of the trip being the rush-hour traffic in L.A.

Gordon, who was also the vessel consultant during the 3day shoot on a Malibu beach, reports that the studio treated Townshend well. "They needed the longboat for a flashback to Plymouth Rock," he explains. "They painted her with black poster paint and added snow on the ground digitally. Look for a one-minute scene, two at most."

The \$8,300 Townshend netted for her role will be used to purchase full expeditionary gear for our longboat programs and to acquire a second longboat trailer.

The funds have covered the costs of merging our databases, computer upgrades, legal and accounting assistance, and strategic planning consulting. Ongoing work includes messaging and branding.

We launched the boating season with an Opening Day celebration in May, taught 16 sessions of youth and adult Learn to Sail classes, and had a waiting list for the summer youth sea
